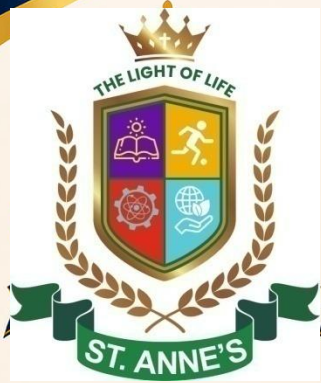
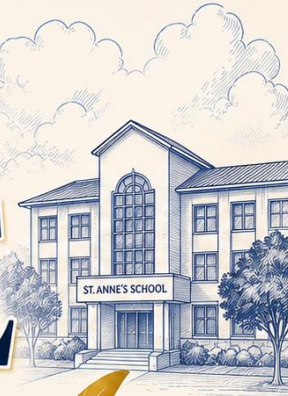

Encourage Parental Involvement: Holiday homework enables parents to actively support and monitor their child's learning.

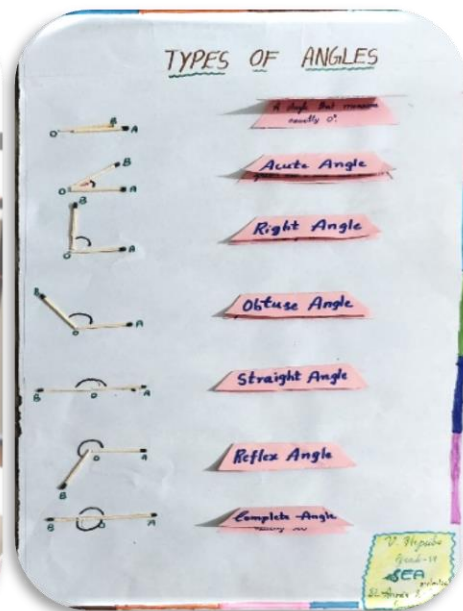
Provide Opportunity for Revision: It allows students to revise previously learned topics and prepare for the upcoming academic session.

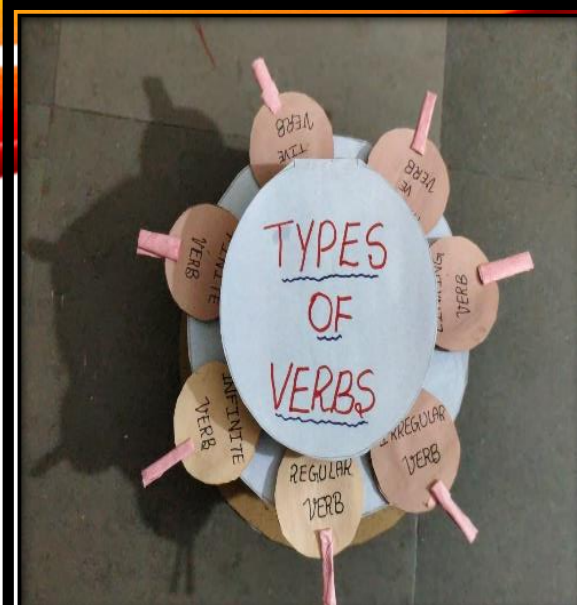

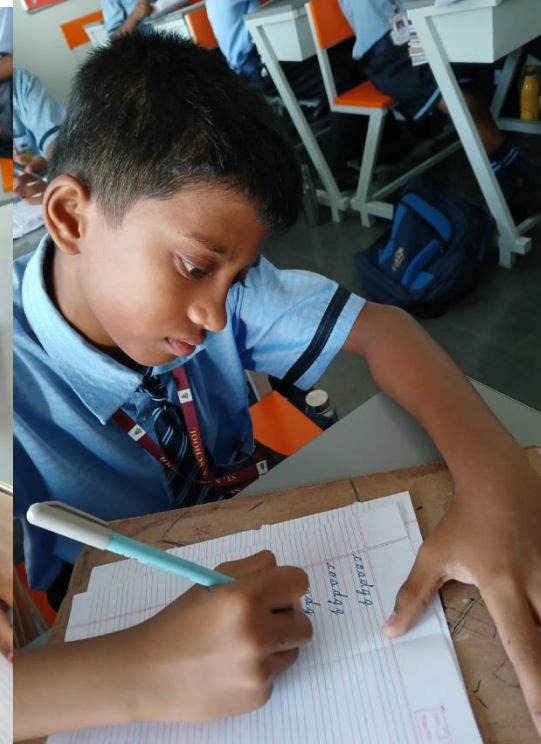
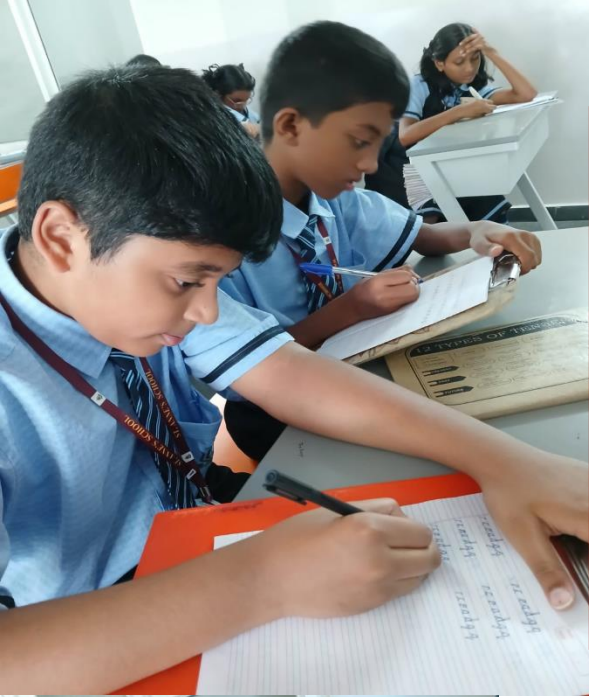


The Benefits of Cursive Writing

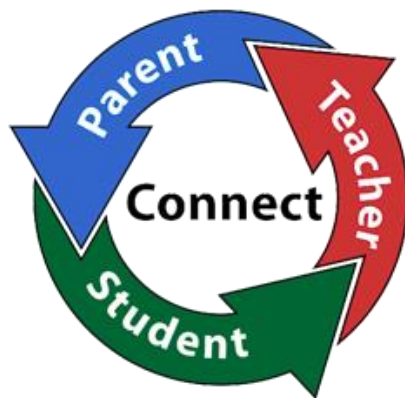
